

QUARTERLY METRICS



NUMBER OF NEIGHBORS

Between July 1 and September 30th, 2025, HFTICC served 267 individuals, including 11 Veterans. While most were adults, this number includes 54 children under the age of 18, and 21 youth between 18 and 24. 50% identified as female and 71% as Black/African American. 43% were chronically homeless, and 41% reported a chronic health condition. 54% reported a mental health condition, 36% reported a substance use disorder, 17% reported a developmental disability and 23% reported a physical disability.

POSITIVE EXITS

Between July 1 and September 30th, 2025, our team had 82 positive exits. This means 82 neighbors are no longer living in a place not meant for human habitation (e.g., street, car, abandoned building), and have moved into permanent, temporary, or emergency shelter living situations.

IN PERMANENT HOUSING

Between July 1 and September 30th, 2025, our team moved 29 neighbors to permanent housing situations! We are so excited to welcome these neighbors home!

Meet Nick

When you meet Nick, you quickly notice two things: his deep compassion and his calm, intentional presence. As an Outreach Case Manager, Nick spends his days walking the streets of Uptown Charlotte—connecting with neighbors, offering resources, and building trust, one conversation at a time.

For Nick, this work isn't about checking boxes—it's about connection.

"I've worked for numerous nonprofit organizations whose interest is to change and improve society... here I actually experience the most genuine desire to directly improve the conditions of others on a micro level which certainly reverberates to the wellbeing of society."

These services are essential—without valid identification, individuals are often unable to secure employment, access housing, or enroll in supportive services. JDIM steps into that gap with practical, life-changing support that restores both opportunity and confidence.

In addition to housing and ID assistance, JDIM has recently expanded its impact by offering workforce development services—helping neighbors gain the skills, training, and job placement resources they need to move toward long-term independence.
